Get to Know One Another

Has there been a time that you wanted to grow spiritually, but you didn't seem to have the power to do it?

BELIEVE

Read this Week's Scripture

It has been a couple of weeks since we were in Acts - we covered the last of chapter 18 and the very beginning of 19. We read that Paul returned to Antioch before his trip to Ephesus. This marked the beginning of his third and final missionary journey. In our time today, we're going to cover the middle of Chapter 19. We're going to see Paul continuing to teach the Word [along with his disciples] in Ephesus. In the city of Ephesus, we are going to read that God's Word is taught and repentance of sin happens as a result. This revival changes the economic climate of the city, as they had previously relied on magic to provide prosperity and health. As a result of the gospel, the people determine to rid themselves of these "resources."

Question 1: What kinds of things do we rely on to bring about our own prosperity and health?

BUILD

Engage the Scripture

Have someone in your group read Acts 19:8-10

Question 2: In what ways is Paul's experience in Ephesus similar to his experiences in Corinth?

- How long does he continue his ministry in Ephesus and the surrounding area? [Acts 19:8-10]
- What do you think is different for Paul now in Ephesus compared to his previous stops?

Question 3: Acts 19:8-10 describes to us that disciple making is a long-term commitment. For 2 years, Paul taught the Word so that "all the residents of Asia heard the Word".

- Based on what we learned in these verses, what does Luke want us to see is absolutely
 ESSENTIAL in discipleship?
- What does discipleship look like in your life are you investing in someone daily with the Scripture - to see them mature in Christ?

Have someone in your group read Acts 19:11-13

Question 4: In Acts 19:11-13, explain how Paul's exposition of the Scriptures impacted Ephesus.

- What were some of the miracles that appear in Acts 19:11-12.
- Do you think Paul's miracles validated his teaching of the gospel in Ephesus? How?
- In Acts 19:13, what were some of the misapplications of these miracles?

Have someone in your group read Acts 19:14-16

Question 5: Who are we introduced to in Acts 19:14-17? [seven sons of Sceva]

- What were they attempting to do what was their "job"? [they were Jewish itinerant exorcists]
- What misunderstanding do they have about using the power of God?
- How does Luke's account of the sons of Sceva apply to the church today?
 - Is the church more like Paul or the sons of Sceva?
- Today, do you think that evil spirits recognize that God as He was working through Paul is working through the church?

Question 6: Can we distinguish between genuine spiritual authority and counterfeit claims, as illustrated in the case of the sons of Sceva? How?

Have someone in your group read Acts 19:17-20

Question 7: In verses 17-20, we read that the people of Ephesus take notice of the failed exorcism. Based on these verses, what were the reactions of the people? [fear of God, confession, praise toward God, repentance, costly sacrifice, humility, belief in Jesus, evangelism]

- What was the result or what did the people do as a result? [burned their books]
- What was the value of these books?

Question 8: Seeing that the power of God was stronger than any magic, we read about the drastic measures the believers in Ephesus took to get rid of their magic.

• What actions - even drastic ones - are we taking to get rid of "things" that keep us from seeing the power of God in our own lives?

How should it change the way you pray, think, speak or act this week?

- Spend some group time-sharing requests and praying specifically for them.
- Spend some time praying for FBC and how God is working in and through FBC Portland.
