Read this Week's Scripture

Last week, we read the first half of Acts 17. This week, we will be in the second half of Acts 17 - and we'll pick up with Paul entering the city of Athens. It is on this trip that we get to see a little bit of Paul's evangelistic versatility - as he starts with the Jews in the synagogue and then moves to the Gentile marketplace. This passage is one of the most popular passages in the book of Acts, and in this passage we are able to see the ministry heart of Paul - which provides us with important lessons for engaging unbelievers today.

Have someone in your group read Acts 17:16-21

BUILD

Engage the Scripture

Question 1: As Paul is waiting for his boys in Athens, the Scripture says, "his spirit was provoked within him as he saw that the city was full of idols." What do you think this means?

- How did he respond?
- Have you experienced a similar feeling?

Question 2: Do you think that people still worship idols?

What are some of the idols worshiped in our culture?

Question 3: What made the speakers want to hear more from Paul?

- Was Paul afraid of sounding strange to the people of Athens?
- What about the gospel message is strange to unbelievers?

Have someone in your group read Acts 17:22-31

Question 4: What about Paul's speech at the Aeropagus most resonates with you?

Question 5: How did Paul use the culture around him to make a bridge into the gospel message?

What are some bridges in your culture to the gospel?

Question 6: In Paul's speech at the Aeropagus, he seems to find common ground with the Athenians BUT also corrects their thinking. I'm going to read some of the verses below and I want you to tell me if Paul is affirming the Athenians or refuting them.
